What we are learning this term:

- English: We are continuing to follow the 'Talk for Writing' structure within our English lessons. The children will learn a story or non-fiction text and will innovate it in order to create their own. Encourage your children to story map and box up their own stories at home.
- We will continue to focus on GPS within English as well as teaching daily spelling lessons with phonics support if needed.

What we are learning this term:

Maths: We will continue to learn the four different operations (+, -, X and \div). Please encourage your children to use the different vocabulary for each operation.

Olympic Maths: Each week the children will have a timed (3 minutes) test on their times tables. Please help them to learn their tables off by heart.



S.A.Ts
